I watched four family members die of cancer. As painful as it was, death came at just the right moment. The advances in pain management medications and techniques have added some measure of merciful relief. Terminal illness changes the lives of everyone around the dying person. Our culture values productivity and terminally ill people are not materially productive. There are values beyond the ability to care for oneself or be of material usefulness. There is intrinsic value in life and relationships. Relationships often reach their deepest in the last days of life.
