Since its inception, Centro has served as a safe haven for our local Latino community, low-income migrant farmworkers, immigrant and refugee communities, and all who seek our assistance.* Our mission is to be a home for Latino cultures, focusing on the needs of our diverse community by promoting personal growth and empowerment. We work to empower Latino families, *low-income migrant farmworkers, and immigrant refugee communities by removing barriers, fostering well-being, and building the power necessary for achieving economic prosperity. Centro centers the experiences of those most affected in our communities, and we are committed to reducing barriers at every level of our work.* 

Centro Cultural leads with its past, present, and future when supporting Oregon farmworkers. As an organization founded by farmworkers, we are dedicated to bridging the gaps that these workers face in the workforce. Farmworkers are the backbone of Oregon's agricultural economy, which thrives largely due to their robust labor force. Therefore, we support efforts aimed at protecting Oregon farmworkers.

We urge committee members to remember Oregon's past and future by supporting our farmworkers. Make a bold statement by voting YES on HB 2548-7, which funds a study through Portland State University.
