The new CEO of the World Economic Forum was recently the CEO of Nestle, and infamously holds that people do not have a right to water. This claim that corporations, like the State of Oregon, have usurped the rights of natural men, women, and children to the resources of their private properties, and can seize or sell them to whomever profits best the corporation while people languish for want, is a crime against humanity. Corporations are not people. They are legal fictions - lies - and mere agreements that have no rights. People born of mothers alone have rights, endowed with them solely by their natural birth. Their agreements do not, and the State of Oregon is only an agreement of people how to do things hereabouts. This bill is not a way the people of Oregon want to do things, but is a trick corporations can play to take what belongs to people. Oregon, like all governments, is a corporation that the people own, and this means that the State of Oregon has no right, nor lawful power, to take their property, which cutting their inherent rights to enjoy their water, that is their property, does.

This bill does not do that, and worsens tyranny Oregon imposes rather than reduces it.
