Oregon Legislators,

Do not pass HB 238 A.

This proposed bill is a violation of peoples Constitutional Fourth Amendment Civil Right: “The right of the people to be secure in their persons, houses, papers, and effects, against unreasonable searches and seizures, shall not be violated, and no Warrants shall issue, but upon probable cause, supported by Oath or affirmation, and particularly describing the place to be searched, and the persons or things to be seized.”

This amendment clearly states that the people have the right to not be unreasonably searched without a warrant for probable cause. It must be assumed that the “drones” or Unmanned Aerial Vehicles used by law enforcement agencies may have the ability to search/record with cameras and listen/record audio. Law enforcement agencies are armed, have personnel fitness requirements, and access to trained canines. Law enforcement should continue do its job with its current tool sets, instead of seeking to bypass our court system and infringing on the people’s fourth amendment rights by using surveillance technology at will.

Do not continue to infringe upon the people's Constitutional Human and Civil Rights.
