Measure, Appointment or Topic: HB2025

I strongly oppose HB 2025 and urge lawmakers to reject this bill. Hiking the gas tax by 37.5%, jacking up registration and title fees by 270%, and slapping new taxes on vehicles—especially during a period of economic uncertainty and inflation—is both reckless and harmful to working- and middle-class Oregonians.

This isn't just a tax hike. It's an attack on mobility, small business owners, commuters, and every family that relies on a vehicle. The idea that these funds will go toward empty bus lines and politically driven infrastructure like "equity bike lanes" while roads crumble and traffic worsens is a slap in the face to taxpayers.
