Like me, 30 percent of Oregonians are not able to drive a car, therefore, making that same 30 percent of all Oregonians relaient on public transportation all over Oregon. I have spent time in both, urban and rarel environments. In both environments, we can't get around without public transportation. Many of us either live by ourselves or with other people who work and are not always able to drive us around anywhere. Without public transportation, we can't go anywhere, including but not limited to school, work, church, doctor's appointments, social gatherings, or locations where we volunteer at each time we do that kind of work. Unfortunently, public transportation has been underfunded for years, which needs to change in order for the unlucky 30 percent of all Oregonians to have the most independent live as possible. We also need that transportation to be safe because we want to get from point a to point b in one peace. With all that said, I personally use my local city busses, or use ride share to get around to many of my appointments. I also want to insure that if a disaster came along, that I would still have the same quallity of my city busses and ride share avalible. I have studied the Castcadia fault in geology while I attended Chemeketa Community College, before i graduated from there in 2023. I got to hear all about how this kind of earth quake would distroy many roads, highways, and bridges.
