I write today in **support of the increased transit funding and the STIF program** in HB 2025. The increased funding for the STIF program in this package will help prevent significant cuts to public transit service across Oregon.

- My Name is Kyle Duncan. I am a property manager in Bethany, Oregon, and I use both the Trimet MAXLine and Bethany Link RideShare programs in my long commute from downtown Portland. I just started my new career, and I am completely reliant on these two systems to get to work. I have a long commute, but for now, the services are stable and are the backbone of my daily schedule. I ride with a full house each way, and there are many, many more throughout the day. In addition, I manage an apartment complex of 340 units (+1000 individuals) who rely heavily on both services.
- Any disruption to either of these services would be catastrophic to my career and
 economic well-being, as it would be for many of the PCC students and clients with
 whom I share the bus. Public transit has been proven to be a boon for individuals on the
 lower end of the income spectrum (such as myself) to reach financial stability and
 become more self-sufficient.
- As stated above, I utilize both Portland-based Trimet MAX, and the Bethany Link Ride Share program. The Bethany Link drivers: Anthony, Amos, Cindy, Mike and others, as well as all the Trimet drivers are great at what they do.
- I would probably lose my job, housing, and my way of life would soon become in jeopardy. I've travelled a decent amount, and Portland has one of the best transit systems I've utilized. I will do my part to continue to make sure it is strong and available for everyone, and I hope you will use your considerable power to ensure this service remains viable for the thousands who use it every day.

While the funding proposed in this package is not enough to provide the additional transit service I would like to see, it will prevent Oregonians like me from being stranded without the transportation access I depend on. Please support HB 2025.
