Re: HB 2025 - Oppose New Taxes, Increases

Co-Chair McLane, Co-Chair Gorsek and Members of the Joint Committee on Transportation Reinvestment,

I am writing in strong opposition HB 2025. Reasons for my opposition include:

- ◆ HB 2025 adds 35+ new taxes, tax hikes, and fee increases that expand current non-essential spending that Oregonians simply cannot afford.
- ◆ HB 2025 will make it more expensive for families to drop their kids off at school, drive to work, and pick up groceries.
- ◆ HB 2025 will cost families across Oregon "over \$1 billion a year."
- ◆ HB 2025 doubles down on transportation services Oregonians don't use, funding empty buses and poorly traveled bike lanes while cars are jammed in traffic.
- ◆ Oregonians in my district tell me that the cost of living is the number one issue they face.
- ◆ Oregon's average gas prices are the fifth most expensive in the nation
- ◆ 80% of Oregonians oppose increasing the Gas Tax
- ◆ 79% of Oregonians support cutting taxes to make Oregon more affordable*
- ◆ Oregon ranks as the 10th most expensive state to live in according to Forbes.

Therefore I ask you not to move HB 2025 forward. Instead leverage the ideas of reprioritizing ODOT spending and cost savings found in the Republican proposal, HB 3982.
