Hi, HB 2025 needs amending to support acting on Climate change that is happening NOW.

Oregon community paths are important to the majority of Oregonians and should be funded.

This bill can be funded IF the right contracts are found so I ask that the contracts be heavily scrutinized to avoid buyer frustration and remorse. Whole areas of Oregon so not need to be owned by outside entities who do not make maintenance easy. Oregon should be owned by Oregonians anyway and not find out that swaths of land are not. It's probably already happened but that problematic reality does not need to continue for residents of Oregon.

One thing that is seldom acted upon is an end to the neo-feudalism. We need to believe when we are taxed it delivers for us. The following is the right way on fully funding what should be PUBLICLY Funded and may not be in our time of austerity which is being inflicted by those who refuse to acknowledge it doesn't have to be that way:

Here's the fix: a 4% tax on luxury vehicles over \$75,000 that will pay for transportation electrification and fund Oregon Community Paths. This is a smart and fair way to fill the gaps we've been advocating for within the transportation package. This modest surcharge on the state's most expensive cars would mean that the middle-class has no hit to their wallets while we fulfill our state priorities and commitments, which were overlooked by lawmakers in the current bill. This change to the transportation package will enable needed clean vehicle investments to reduce emissions, protect public health, and support Oregon - OCLV

It's the flat taxes that I sneer at. I need to believe that the state and our taxes we pay are used in ways that work for us. We should not want anarchy nor should we say no to all taxes. That means acting on climate change instead of creating doomerism and taxation asks that do not squeeze the 99 % of Oregonians wallets dry. We need to see HB 2025 as a vibrant transportation bill that protects our environment and Safely gets us everywhere in Oregon leaving Nothing out that gets us to that end.
