Composition³

The commission consists of 15 Oregon residents serving as voting members who are well informed concerning the principles of higher education. Membership includes

- one public university undergraduate student (ARNOT);
- one public university graduate student (NJUE);
- one public university faculty member (SIMNITT);
- one community college student (LAWSON);
- one community college faculty member (MIDDLETON);
- one public university or community college nonfaculty staff member (SMITH);

- one member from each of the six congressional districts (FAJARDO (CD1), YAMASAKI (CD2), KOCHER (CD3), HAMANN (CD4), PROCTER ANDREWS (CD5), DEVLIN (CD6)); and
- three members of the general public (**DEMBROW**, EDWARDS, MARTINEZ).

Appointees from the congressional districts and from the general public serve four-year terms and the remainder serve two-year terms. The Governor may, for cause, remove any member after notice and a public hearing, but not more than three members shall be removed within a period of four years, unless it is for corrupt conduct in office.⁴ The commission selects its chair and vice chair. A majority of the members constitutes a quorum. The commission must meet at least once every three months.⁵

Duties⁶

The commission works to ensure access to post-secondary education and academic success. The commission must:

- establish educational attainment goals for certain adults, and develop goals for post-secondary education;
- appoint an executive director:
- determine strategic investments, and adopt a strategic plan;
- coordinate post-secondary data collection and administer a longitudinal data system;
- recommend a consolidated higher education agency request;
- adopt rules governing the distribution of appropriations;
- approve or deny any significant change to academic programs;
- approve public university mission statements; review fee increases; advise the Governor and Legislative Assembly about university governance issues; and authorize degrees offered by independent post-secondary institutions;
- oversee the licensing of career schools;
- implement a review process for, and appropriately act on, student complaints;
- advise on specified policies, and administer specified funds and grant programs;
- ensure the implementation of diverse educator recruitment plans;
- make specified reports to the Legislative Assembly;
- monitor and report on participation of specified groups in higher education;
- conduct annual reviews of each public institution of higher education; and
- develop standards for transferring and awarding education credits.
