HB 4041: Department of Corrections Sentence Calculations

Public Hearing

HB 4043 **

**Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means

Authorizes the State Treasurer to issue Article XI-Q general obligation bonds to finance renovation or expansion of courthouses.

HB 4106

Declares that peace officers are immune from criminal and civil liability for the use of restraints or physical force during the transportation of a person subject to involuntary treatment, provided certain criteria are met.

HB 4137

Provides that, in lieu of making a first appearance for a traffic violation citation, the person who is the previous owner of a vehicle may notify the court that the person has transferred interest in the vehicle and is not liable for the citation.

HB 4140

Modifies the crime of criminal mischief in the first degree by expanding the types of telecommunications entities whose property may be subject to ORS 164.

HB 4041

Directs the Department of Justice to study whether legislative changes are needed concerning credit for time served and post-conviction relief petitions based on nonunanimous jury verdicts.

HB 4043 **

**Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means

Authorizes the State Treasurer to issue Article XI-Q general obligation bonds to finance renovation or expansion of courthouses.

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HB 4045

Requires a communications provider to respond to a search warrant within 72 hours of service when the warrant pertains to an investigation of stalking or a crime constituting domestic violence.

HB 4072

Excludes specified periods of time from the time period within which a person released from custody must be arraigned.

HB 4096

Creates the crime of aggravated felon in possession of a firearm when a person who has been convicted of a felony possesses three or more firearms or has certain prior convictions.

HB 4145

Modifies the firearm permit provisions of Ballot Measure 114 (2022).

HB 4111

Provides that evidence of a party's or a witness's immigration status is not admissible as evidence in a civil proceeding.

HB 4114

Creates a civil cause of action against federal law enforcement agents and law enforcement agents of another state in specified circumstances.

HB 4138

Requires law enforcement agencies to enact policies concerning identifying information on law enforcement uniforms.

HB 4151

Increases the penalties for the crime of initiating a false report when the report causes an enhanced law enforcement response that results in physical injury or death.

HB 4157

Provides that certain hearsay statements related to certain sex crimes are not inadmissible in evidence, even though the declarant is available as a witness.
