Public Hearing

SB 1516

Expands the crime of aggravated harassment to include threats concerning public officials in specified circumstances.

SB 1553

Prohibits an electric company from recovering from retail electricity consumers certain litigation or settlement costs or expenses if a court or jury finds that a wildfire resulted from the negligence or a higher degree of fault on the part of the electric company.

SB 1571

Adds definition of "nicotine" and expands definition of "tobacco products."

SJR 203 **

**Subsequent Referral(s) to Rules

Proposes an amendment to the Oregon Constitution providing that law enforcement officers may not be masked and must wear certain identifying information except in specified circumstances. Refers the proposed amendment to the people for their approval or rejection at the next regular general election.

SB 1587

Prohibits data brokers from providing data to others for purposes related to enforcement of civil law, except pursuant to a court order.

Work Session

SB 1594

Directs the Office of Immigrant and Refugee Advancement to develop and maintain model policies, standards and procedures related to the enforcement of federal immigration laws.

SB 1516

Expands the crime of aggravated harassment to include threats concerning public officials in specified circumstances.

SB 1517

Modifies provisions relating to liability related to skiing.

SB 1530

Expands the crime of aggravated harassment to include threats concerning public officials in specified circumstances.

SB 1545

Establishes immunity from action for trespass for persons that corner cross on public land.

SB 1563

Allows a person who has been deprived of rights, privileges or immunities secured by the Oregon Constitution or the laws of this state by a person acting under color of law to bring a civil action for economic and noneconomic damages and for injunctive or other equitable relief.

SB 1579

Modifies the offense of making a false report of child abuse.

SB 1515

Modifies provisions relating to petitions for compensation for wrongful conviction.

SB 1550

Directs law enforcement, prior to making any findings as to the cause or manner of death where the decedent is suspected to have died from suicide, overdose or accident, to interview family members of the decedent if the decedent has a history as a victim of domestic violence or child abuse and certain conditions exist.

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
