

Senate Bill 5703

Sponsored by JOINT COMMITTEE ON WAYS AND MEANS (at the request of Senator Kate Lieber)

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**. The statement includes a measure digest written in compliance with applicable readability standards.

Digest: The Act is a budget bill for an unspecified state agency. (Flesch Readability Score: 64.9). Establishes biennial appropriations and expenditure limitations for _____ for the biennium ending June 30, 2027.

Declares an emergency, effective on passage.

3 **Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:**

4 **SECTION 1.** There is appropriated to _____, for the biennium ending June 30, 2027, out
5 of the General Fund, the amount of \$_____ for _____.

6 **SECTION 2.** Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the amount of \$_____
7 is established for the biennium ending June 30, 2027, as the maximum limit for payment of
8 expenses for _____ from fees, moneys or other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts,
9 but excluding lottery funds and federal funds, collected or received by the _____.

10 **SECTION 3.** Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the amount of \$_____
11 is established for the biennium ending June 30, 2027, as the maximum limit for payment of
12 expenses for _____ from federal funds collected or received by the _____.

13 **SECTION 4.** This 2026 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public
14 peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2026 Act takes effect
15 on its passage.
