However, in recent cases of ICE/CBP, officers and unidentified people claiming to be officers have actually interfered with medical treatment.

Professional Caregivers report that ICE/CBP operatives are creating environments where providing care to patients is obstructed, care is delayed, and at times have been prevented from providing care. This is simply unacceptable. Without taking a position on the controversial nature of ICE/CBP activities and related matters, common sense should prevail here. Hospitals and healthcare facilities are for medical treatment and healing. Let's keep them this way, for the sake of all.
