Co-Chairs Helm and Owens, members of the Committee:

I urge you to oppose HB 4006. Oregon's water belongs to the public. Exempting irrigators in one area of the state from important water laws that every other farmer in Oregon must adhere to is not good for the Columbia River, the Umatilla Basin, or our state.

As a prior resident of the state of Arizona, I saw first hand what happens when foreign interests acquire properties with water rights that allow usage above and beyond. This bill would set up the potentiality for that to happen. We need Oregon water for Oregonians.

As a salmon lover, I also oppose increasing, without control, gallons of agricultural water. Please keep rules in place.

This bill undermines the Oregon Water Resources Department's ability to manage over 700,000 acres of irrigated agriculture, and sets a dangerous precedent.

I am also concerned about the effect of increased agriculture on the groundwater quality of the Lower Umatilla Basin Ground Water Management Area, as increased irrigation risks increased nitrate inputs into groundwater.

Please oppose this bill.
