As a small business owner that heavily relies on tourism for my area, I oppose those funds going to a general fund. As the past president of the Hermiston Chamber of Commerce, I have personally seen first hand how municipalities try to use those funds (lodging tax funds) for other things or delay using the tourism dollars. Those funds are a vital part of a city/county that normally would not use the funds for tourism. Everyone seems to be a tourism expert and that is the problem. When you put those dollars in a general fund, I can promise you that as city/counties are being forced to shorten every budget...those extra funds will cover expenses that are NOT for tourism. Tourism in my area(Eastern Oregon) relies on visitors, those who live over 50 miles away and come here for a specific reason.
