Dear Co-Chairs Helm and Owens and Members of the Committee,

I oppose House Bill 4105.

This timber industry bill undermines the state forest Habitat Conservation Plan and would result in more lawsuits, less habitat for salmon and wildlife, more clearcuts and pesticide spraying that harm drinking water, and less carbon storage. The preservation of our forests is absolutely vital to the habitability of the planet and the health of every living thing, not just the nonhuman beings on the land being treated as a commodity. Even in light of base self interest, it makes no sense to destroy these ecosystems.

I urge you to oppose this bill. Instead, I encourage this committee to focus on measures that would increase carbon storage in our state forests and safeguard our public resources for our children and future generations.
