Measure, Appointment or Topic: SB1598

Hi, I am opposed to SB1598 on the grounds it creates unchecked authority by granting broad power to un-elected public health officials to make decisions affecting all of us, without further legislation or public debate. It creates automatic mandates by clearing the way for vaccine requirements to affect access to schools — without another legislative vote. It forces compliance by invoking statewide one-size-fits-all medical orders without individual consent. It creates taxpayer-funded mandates that compels insurance companies and taxpayer-supported public programs to pay in full for vaccines and health services. It overrides doctors' medical judgment by removing ability of physicians to make decisions in the best interest of their patients.

Furthermore, The Academy of Pediatric Physicians is being sued by the Informed Consent Action Network under the RICO Racketeering statute on grounds they colluded with Big Pharma to advance a vaccine schedule for children that is not tested and vetted for efficacy and safety. This case raises questions about the APP and their allegiance with Big Pharma and concerns for children's health.

Moreover, Texas Attorney General Ken Paxton is suing Big Pharma and Big Insurance over incentives provided to pediatric physicians to give shots.

As a proponent for a Green Liberty Caucus I cite the story published at The Highwire, and affiliate media company with ICAN.

Do not advance SB 1598 as it empowers medical technocrats to prescribe medical services against the actual choice of parents and patients. It violates informed consent since vaccines are based on untested claims of safe and effective; and it puts physicians in a bind since the orders to vaccinate go against the Hippocratic oath to do no harm.
