I am a small scale organic vegetable farmer, and I very adamantly oppose HB 4153 because it favors big money farms over small farms. It could be devastating for new, young farmers and serious older farmers who have smaller plots. The average age of a farmer in this country is 60 years old. The cost of farmland is skyrocketing, in large part to the domination of big money and out of state investors grabbing our precious arable land. Young small farmers are having a harder and harder time accessing land and having real opportunities to grow food. WE NEED YOUNG FARMERS so that our future generations can eat healthy foods! Our ecosystem benefits as well from well-run farms which provide forage and habitat for millions of creatures- from healthy soil organisms to raptors and bees.
