I strongly oppose this bill, or any bill that thinks that mandated health treatments are a good idea. I watched COVID unfold, and I saw how the profoundly corrupt public health establishment demonized those independent doctors who came up with effective COVID treatments. I'm thinking here of the New York doctor Vladimir Zelenko, who successfully treated thousands of patients with hydroxychloroquine, zinc supplements, and azithromycin. Compare that to the official approved treatments, which were ventilators and remdesivir: 90% of the patients put on a ventilators died, and remdesivir's abysmal survival rate was well-known going back to the original trials in Africa. Yet those were essentially mandated, by the incentives put in place by the 2005 Prep Act from Congress, which said that the only way for hospitals and health systems to evade liability was to use the government-approved protocols.

Why were alternative, independent treatments demonized? Because to allow them, or recognize them, would have endangered the Emergency Use Authorization for the horrendous, deadly COVID injections! The EUA was only valid if there "were no other viable treatments."

Which brings me to the COVID injections... I have seen so much death and injury from the COVID shots. I have family members that were injured. I had a colleague collapse and die at work. Mysterious thyroid problems. Heart damage. Eye bleeds. AND YET... with a bill like this I have ZERO doubt that Oregon's political class would not hesitate in the slightest to force a similar injection on the general public. I've watched as the early informed speculation about the dangers of mRNA has turned into confirmed fact. AND STILL THOSE PUSHING THESE SHOTS REFUSE TO ANALYZE THE DATA, REFUSE TO PUBLICLY ENGAGE WITH THOSE WHO HAVE BROUGHT THIS FORWARD.
