To whom it may concern,

" Section (8) states:

(8) A standing order issued under this section may not require a person to receive, use or administer a drug or device or withhold a drug or device from a person."

At first glance, this sounds reassuring. But in legislative language, "MAY not" is very different from "SHALL not." "May not" is permissive, not prohibitive—it allows discretion rather than creating a binding restriction.

In other words, this clause does NOT guarantee that mandates will not occur. It offers NO enforceable protection and leaves the door open for future requirements or mandates imposed by our unelected Public Health Officer.

I thoroughly oppose any mandatory medical interventions. We are not cattle.

Please make sure corrections are made to legislation, to prohibit future attempts to force mandates (for vaccines or any other medical intervention,) on the populace.
