My name is Benjamin Andresen. I'm a proud 4th generation Oregonian and a social worker with PeaceHealth in Eugene. I love my state and I love my community. I'm writing today to express deep concern about any ALPR technology use being codified in law as legitimate law enforcement tool. Stockpiling data on the movements of law-abiding citizens is a massive invasion of privacy. Once collected, there is no way to guarantee it will stay private. If large medical and financial institutions regularly have data breaches, this information surely can as well. I ask you to please do not include language that supports this mass surveillance in any way. If these privacy concerns aren't convincing and language is put in the bill. It is essential that a legal maximum retention period of a week would be sufficient to address all the emergency situations that the salesmen of the ALPR systems reference but provide some protection from bad actors.
