Re: Cornelius Recreation and Community Center Project Funding Request

Dear Committee Members,

I am writing in strong support of the City of Cornelius' request for Capital Construction Lottery Bond funding for the Cornelius Recreation and Community Center. This project is vital not only as a hub for community programs but as a designated emergency shelter – a critical need for a city that has grown nearly 20% in recent years.

Currently, Cornelius has no facility large enough or equipped to provide shelter during a disaster. The City has taken proactive steps by adopting a new Emergency Operations Plan and conducting training exercises. However, without a suitable building, these efforts cannot fully protect residents. Renovating this facility with emergency backup power and other resiliency features will ensure that, in times of crisis, people have a safe and reliable place to go.

Beyond emergency preparedness, this center will strengthen community connections and provide space for recreation and engagement – benefits that improve quality of life every day. For one of the region's most vulnerable communities, this investment is about safety, resilience, and opportunity.
