Measure, Appointment or Topic: SB1516

Chair Prozanski, Vice Chair Thatcher, Members of the Committee,

For the record I am an Oregon resident residing in Waldport.

I'm very concerned about the misuse of Automatic License Plate Readers (ALPR) data and the serious risks it poses to Oregonians' privacy and safety – particularly for immigrants, refugees, and those accessing reproductive healthcare.

In Oregon and across the country ALPR data has been accessed by ICE, and there are documented cases of ALPR data being used to target people accessing abortion services

We ask that this bill include 3 things: Clear prohibitions on access by federal and out-of-state law enforcement agencies; Strong data-security requirements, including for data to be protected with end-to-end encryption; and Strict data retention limits less than 30 days. A 30-day retention period would allow the accumulation of large data troves that endanger vulnerable communities.
