Dear Chair Broadman, Vice-Chair McLane, and members of the committee:

I am writing to you today as a concerned constituent to urge you to protect one of Oregon's most irreplaceable assets: our prime agricultural land. Currently, legislative proposals threaten to rezone 1,700 acres of world-class soil west of Hillsboro for industrial development—specifically for data center expansion.

Oregon possesses some of the most robust, high-value farmland found anywhere on the planet. To pave over these soils for short-term industrial gain would be more than a mistake; it would be an unspeakable loss for our state's future.

**Why This Land Must Be Preserved:**

**Irreplaceable Soil Quality:** The land in question features "prime" soils that are among the best on earth. Once these are covered in concrete and silicon, they are lost to humanity forever.

**Honoring Our Commitments:** These 1,700 acres were explicitly designated as Rural Reserves to be protected until 2065. Overriding this intergovernmental agreement undermines public trust and the integrity of our land-use system.

**Resource Strain:** Converting this land into a data center hub would place an immense strain on our local water supply and increase the risk of contamination, directly threatening the viability of the neighboring agricultural industry.

**Economic Resilience:** While the tech sector is vital to Oregon, it should not come at the expense of our agricultural foundation. Farming is a permanent, regenerative industry that sustains our local economy and environment.

We must honor the promise made to protect these lands for the next generation. I urge you to stand against any efforts to bypass existing protections and to keep these 1,700 acres in agricultural production where they belong.
