Chair Broadman, members of the committee,

My name is Katie Miller and I live near the farmland in question, and I urge you to VOTE NO on SB 1586.

The farmland previously taken into the Hillsboro UGB has barely even developed yet. So why do we need more? There is plenty already within the Hillsboro UGB for further development. This is greed, and this is poor planning. We will need these 1,700 acres of prime farmland when the rest of the USA's farmland is gobbled up by data centers in 50 years.

Also, this is Senator Sollman's FIFTH time trying to bring this land into the UGB. Somebody has her in their pocket--a few farmers who are waiting for their windfall of millions. This needs to stop. The rest of us will pay for this with higher electricity costs and a drain on our water system. This is not what Oregon is about. Because this country is full of people without moral backbones these days, and we need to lead as the example.
