RE: \$2.75 million for the City of Salem — Safe, Clean & Healthy Capital City

Dear Co-Chairs Girod and Nosse,

I am writing to express my support for the City of Salem — Safe, Clean & Healthy Capital City program. These funds would reimburse the City of Salem for the more than \$7 million of fire, EMS and police services that are provided each year for the benefit of the State.

As you know:

- The State does not currently pay any property taxes to the City of Salem for these essential services.
- This is true even though State buildings and land comprise approximately 8% of Salem's total taxable property and are valued at over \$1.8 billion.
- State properties in Salem include not only the State Capitol building and park grounds, but also the 2,040 bed/194 acre Oregon State Penitentiary, the 558 bed Oregon State Hospital, the Supreme Court, The Court of Appeals Buildings, and a large collection of State agency headquarters and facilities.

The more recent 2008 fire resulted in major water damage to then Governor Kulongoski's Ceremonial Office and staff areas on the second and third floors of the Capitol. City of Salem firefighters responded quickly to this blaze, preventing fire damage to the adjoining House and Senate Chambers.
