I'm concerned about, and opposed to, SB 1586.

Converting 1,700 acres of farmland in this fertile region could have significant negative effects, including: increasing the cost of nearby farmland, reducing access to top tier soils, threatening local food security, and hurting the surrounding agricultural economy.

Pitting two key economic sectors — tech and agriculture — against each other is unwise.

We are taking more and more of our farmland out of production. I worry about where we will get our food in the future. Growing food in buildings won't feed the masses. Rich farmland is the best way to go.

I am further concerned about how this industrialization could harm this watershed and impact carbon sequestration.

Please ensure these lands stay as rural reserves until at least 2065.
