Measure, Appointment or Topic: HB4105

HB 4105 shifts the focus of forest management away from balance and adaptability. This bill prioritizes logging and timber production, without considering climate resilience strategies or habitat protection.

Climate risks are not going away. Oregon forests provide carbon sequestration and are necessary for climate resilience; increased logging increases wildfire risk, drought, and extreme weather.

Carbon storage and climate change must be prioritized. This bill weakens Oregon's ability to meet climate commitments and devalues the role of forests in climate management.

When forests are protected, and climate resilience is prioritized, Oregon communities thrive. While logging is a critical sector of Oregon's economy, it should not come at the expense of rural communities who are already facing extreme challenges due to climate change.
