SB 1586 would bring 1,700 acres of world-class farm land into Hillsboro's UGB for industrial development, even though the land is currently designated as rural reserves. This designation means this land shouldn't be touched until 2065. This land is not just "empty space" It is actively being farmed and has Class 1 & 2 soils, some of the best in the world. Many farmers who would like to purchase this land are not being offered the opportunity to buy it.
