ACCESS TO HPV VACCINATION AND CERVICAL CANCER SCREENING IS UNEVEN ACROSS OREGON, WITH RURAL COMMUNITIES, LOW-INCOME FAMILIES, AND COMMUNITIES OF COLOR FACING THE GREATEST BARRIERS.

WHAT HB 4135 DOES:

- DESIGNATES MARCH 4TH AS HPV AWARENESS DAY IN OREGON.
- PROMOTES HPV VACCINATION & ROUTINE CERVICAL CANCER SCREENINGS ACROSS THE STATE.
- RECOGNIZES THE ROLE OF HPV IN CAUSING SEVERAL TYPES OF CANCER.
- ACKNOWLEDGES DISPARITIES IN OREGON'S HPV VACCINATION COMPLETION RATES & ACCESS TO ROUTINE CANCER SCREENING.
- ENCOURAGES OHA, SCHOOLS, COUNTY HEALTH DEPARTMENTS, AND ORGS TO SHARE PREVENTION INFORMATION ON MARCH 4TH EVERY YEAR.
